PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

We are thrilled to announce that the second defibrillator has been installed on the mill building. Huge thanks to the Confest Committee who



donated proceeds from this year's festival to fund the purchase of the defib, and to Laura Rowe, our local defib guardian, who has kindly offered to check that the device is rescue ready. -Big thanks to everyone who took part in October's litter pick; the next one will be in the New Year.

-Improvements to the allotment path at the Meadow Lane site will start in December - access will be retained whilst the work is completed.

-Early next year we will be conducting a village survey to request feedback from residents about the things that matter to them most.

-Following recent incidents of HGVs getting stuck and damaging property, we ask residents to send photos showing the registration number and company name to

cononleypc@gmail.com so that we can advise accordingly. Finally, we continue to liaise regularly with North Yorkshire Council about streetlights repairs and highways issues.

THERMAL CAMERA LOAN SCHEME

With winter upon us, residents can once again borrow the thermal camera to locate draughty spots in the home. The camera was used 26 times last year to find draughty



windows, cold spots and missing insulation patches. Simple improvements, such as sealing gaps in floorboards and windows, draught excluders, insulating lofts and cellars can make your house warmer and save money on heating bills. Some residents undertook bigger jobs such as installing solar panels, new windows, underfloor insulation and heat pumps. Highways issues continue to be a challenge, but after a lot of pressure from myself and the PC, Crosshills Road was finally resurfaced



even if parts of it were dug up a week later! The next job is to get the appalling state of Main Street sorted. Disappointingly, this is not on the schedule for this or next year's financial year, so I have been asking a lot of questions and trying to get it included in the plans for the following year. There is little point in doing basic repairs whilst building traffic is moving through the village, but I am told a schedule of regular repair work will be underway whilst we wait for the needed resurfacing.
